Syringe Driver Training

PalEd is the Hospice New Zealand endorsed online Syringe Driver Competency Programme. If you are a registered or enrolled nurse within the mid and far north region you can now enroll free of charge.

It will give you an overview of how to care for people with palliative care needs in your role as a healthcare worker.
